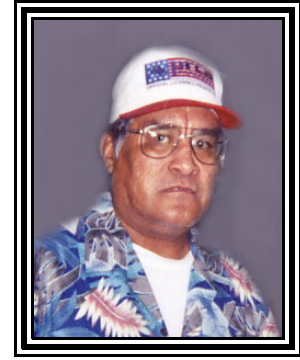


# Obituary
