She also enjoyed talking on the phone, shopping and visiting with her family and friends. Eunice was very supportive of those around her and bought beadwork and dried meats to help families out who were in need.

She was a proud sponsor for the Buffalo Horn Singers and the Young Buffalo Horn Singers that traveled throughout the Northwest and Northern Plains in the United States. She was also a proud vendor at numerous pow-wows in the Northwest, selling Native American Arts and Crafts and beadwork made by herself and family members.

She was preceded in death by both her parents, Minnie Snipe and Ollie Farmer; siblings, Ollie Jr., MacCardy, Walker, Maretta, Davis, Loveland, Inice, Everette and Winna'gee Farmer; daughter, Roseanne Short, infant son, Ronnie Evening, "Sonny" Daniel Bill Evening, Jr., Saud "Tucky" Fisher and Edward T.
