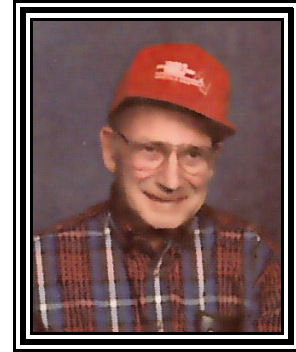


Obituary
