Tobie Kade Robinson, 23, of Blackfoot, passed away Thursday, April 14, 2011 from injuries sustained in an automobile accident.

His family was the center to his life. Around Labor Day each year he would go camping with his father and brothers, that created an unbreakable bond between them. He was a loyal son and brother. In his free time he liked to skate and would take to the street whenever he could. He enjoyed restoring and working on old pickups. He also had a rare talent for woodworking and making furniture. Not one to exhibit entitlement, Tobie was known for his work ethic and wanted to earn his way. He was an intense competitor and still loved to play soccer. He played each year in the Blackfoot Men's Soccer League and was especially looking forward to playing with his three brothers on the same team this summer. He did things his way and was able to laugh at himself with ease. He truly made an impact on all who knew him.

At the time of his death Tobie was working for Modern Steel Buildings. Previously, he worked in Jackson Hole as a mason.
