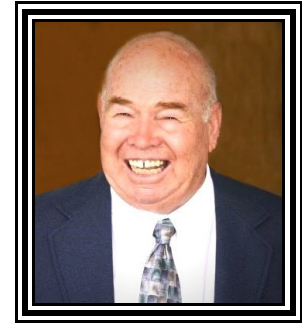


Obituary
