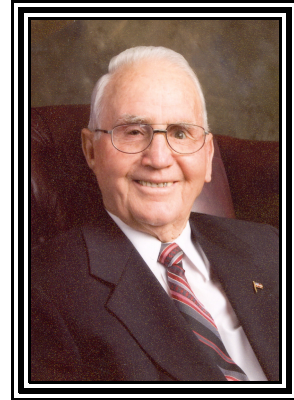


Obituary

Lynn M. Wolfley, 89



Lynn Wolfley, 89, of Riverside, Idaho passed away Friday, April 8, 2011 in Blackfoot, five days after his lifelong companion of seventy years, at The Willow Assisted Living Center.

Lynn was born May 12, 1921 in Etna, Wyoming, the youngest child of eleven to Henry Louise and Jeanette May McGavin Wolfley. He attended first through eighth grade in Etna, Wyoming and graduated from Moreland High School in 1940, where he excelled as a boxer.

On December 3, 1940 Lynn married Thelma Lou Adams in the Salt Lake LDS Temple. He was an active member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and served in many capacities, including Ward Mission Leader, High Priest Group Leader, and Home Teacher. He and his wife served a mission together in New Zealand in 1984. They also served as temple ordinance workers in the Idaho Falls Temple for many years. He enjoyed his callings and always served faithfully.

He served in WWII in 1945 as an infantryman and later in the Air Force. He was honorably discharged in July 1946. He was very patriotic and loved his country.

His lifetime occupation was a farmer and dairyman. He farmed in Emmett, Idaho prior to WWII. Upon returning from the service he purchased a farm in Riverside, Idaho. He farmed in the Riverside-Moreland area for many years, until his retirement in 1984.

He enjoyed riding horses, camping, fishing, traveling with his wife and visiting his children and grandchildren. He also enjoyed all kinds of sports, especially watching his sons, grandsons and great-grandsons wrestle.

He will be remembered for his hard work on his farm, provider for his family and service to his friends and neighbors.

Lynn is survived by his children: Jerry Lynn (Dennis) Shanklin, of Glendale, California; Lou Dawn (Tim) Hall, Gilbert, Arizona; Shauna (Ted) Nielsen, Herriman, Utah; Karen (Greg) McCallow, Saugus, California; R. Kim (Patricia) Wolfley, Moreland, Idaho; twenty grandchildren and forty-four great grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Thelma, parents, brothers: Laron M., Louis Elmer, Robert M., William Henry and Milford; sisters, Roziela, Magdalene, Elva, Theresa and Kati.

Funeral services will be held Tuesday, April 21, 2011 at 1:00 p.m. in the Moreland 6th Ward, Blackfoot Idaho Northwest Stake Center, 95 N. 740 W., Moreland, Idaho, with Bishop Mark Adams conducting. The family will meet with friends and relatives from 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Tuesday prior to service at the church.
